**SHOW RULES**

1. Notification of the classes it is wished to enter **must be received** by the Show Secretaries **no later than 10.00 a.m. on Thursday 29<sup>th</sup> June**. If space permits, late entries may be accepted up to **10.00 a.m. on Friday 30<sup>th</sup> June**, on payment of double entry fees, but none will be accepted on Saturday morning.
2. Participation is restricted primarily to exhibitors who are actual Scaynes Hill residents, but as previously agreed and at the Secretaries' discretion, entries may be accepted from genuine members of the various village organisations who live beyond the Parish boundaries.
3. No exhibitor shall make more than one entry per class. All horticultural exhibits must be the bona fide property of and grown by the exhibitor, except in some Floral Art classes. In the Handicraft, Art and Photography Classes, the same exhibit shall not be entered on more than one occasion.
4. In the Art and Photography Classes the term 'Amateur' signifies that the exhibitor performs his/her art, craft or hobby purely for pleasure and not for financial gain.
5. **The Village Centre will be open from 9 a.m.** on the morning of the Show and **ALL EXHIBITS MUST BE IN PLACE BY 11.00 a.m.** when everyone except Show Officials will be asked to leave so that judging can take place. The Judges' decisions to be final.
6. Standard vases in several sizes will be available, if required, but their use is entirely optional. Cookery items should be displayed on suitable plates, dishes, etc. All ordinary care will be taken of exhibitors' property, but no responsibility can be accepted for any loss or damage.
7. Exhibits not intended for auction are to be removed between 3.45 - 4.00 p.m. please.

### FLOWERS

1. 3 sprays Rambler / Climber roses.
2. 3 Hybrid Tea roses.
3. 2 Sprays Floribunda roses.
4. 1 rose, any variety, to be judged for strength of perfume (one prize only - 30p)
5. 4 identical Red roses.
6. Vase of garden roses (no more than 5 stems).
7. 9 stems Sweet Peas (any variety).
8. A vase mixed flowers
9. 5 stems one kind of annual flowers
10. 5 stems one kind of perennial flowers (not shrubs).
11. Foliage pot plant, not to exceed 12" any dimension
12. Hanging basket, planted by exhibitor. Basket prior to planting not to exceed  
12" diameter, the overall exhibit may exceed this diameter.
13. 10" diameter patio pot containing Summer flowers or foliage.

### VEGETABLES

14. 4 potatoes, one variety.
15. 3 carrots (with approx. 2" leaf stalks left on).
16. 1 lettuce (any variety)
17. The heaviest vegetable
18. Bunch of mixed herbs in a jam jar.
19. A misshapen vegetable
20. Any other vegetable, one kind (ask Secretaries quantity required).

### FRUIT

21. 6 raspberries on the stalk.
22. 6 strawberries with calyxes.
23. 6 gooseberries
24. Plate of any other fruit, one kind (ask Secretaries quantity required).

33. A machine or hand sewn article - not more than 24" in any dimension (folded or flat).
34. Any other hand-crafted item, e.g. woodwork, metalwork, cane, jewellery, pottery etc, not more than 30" in any dimension.
35. A handmade greetings card for any occasion (maximum size A4 folded).

#### Recipe for Iced Cinnamon and Carrot Cake (Class 37)

<b>Ingredients:</b>	115g/4 ozs butter softened	115g/4 ozs soft brown sugar
	3 eggs beaten	115g/4 ozs SR flour
	1 carrot grated	1 tspn ground cinnamon
	3 tbspns milk	
<b>Icing:</b>	85g/3 ozs icing sugar	Splash of water

#### Pre-heat oven to gas mark 4, 350°F (180°C)

**Method:** Cream butter and brown sugar until pale and fluffy. Gradually add eggs, fold in flour, carrot and cinnamon. Stir in milk.

Butter a 25cm/10" cake tin. Pour in mixture and smooth surface. Bake for 20 mins until top is springy to touch and skewer comes out clean. Remove from oven and leave to cool. Turn onto a serving plate.

Place icing sugar into a small bowl, add a little water, a teaspoon at a time, stir to make thin icing and drizzle over cake.
